# Issues Raised

- *Unexplained use of guarantee funds regarding the reported expenditure of US\$15 Million for the Marcopper Incident*
- *Fast-tracking of approval of mining tenement applications without following the required consultations with the LGUs*
- *Concern regarding the approval of the Exploration Permit of Philco without first securing the endorsement of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan*
- *Small-scale mining vis-a vis large scale mining*
